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## **Description**



YES FOR PEACE – Bayanihan ng Bayan is a people-centric non-government initiative to mobilize the pro-active involvement and collective participation of the Filipino people and all government agencies in the Whole-of-Nation approach to institutionalize good governance and thereby end armed conflicts through five (5) parallel, stand-alone, and inter-related Thematic Phases – 1) AROUSE; 2) ORGANIZE; 3) MOBILIZE; 4) GOVERGENCE, and 5) LEGISLATIVE ACTION – towards Peace, Unity and Development.



### Talking Points\*



- Yes for Peace Bayanihan ng Bayan as Vehicle for People Participation: The
  campaign is a vehicle, a platform for people participation in their desire for just, equitable
  and lasting peace in the country. It is anchored on the advocacy for our people to claim
  peace as their human right. It is reflected in the results of the Yes for Peace open
  referendum that conveys the sentiments of 15 million Filipinos calling for peace.
- Yes for Peace Bayanihan ng Bayan as Facilitator of Partnership with State
  Bodies: The quest for peace shall be done in partnership with State bodies concerned
  (as a whole-of-nation and whole-of-community endeavor) to ensure that the fulfillment of
  these bodies' respective mandates, i.e., the formulation of policies and programs, the
  implementation of projects, and the pursuit of initiatives, shall impact or will bring about
  peace to the people, their communities, and the country as a whole.
- Yes for Peace Bayanihan ng Bayan on a Mission to Create Local and Global Peace Adherents: The journey to peace must be pursued with a mission to create more adherents to the cause, both domestically and internationally. Various platforms shall be used in their regard, specifically that which State partners can offer, those where international organizations (UN, EU, ASEAN) can partner with, and what media can provide as support, etc.

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## **Thematic** Phases




- 1. AROUSE. Forge a national consensus through an open referendum among Filipinos 10 years and older - on ten (10) questions based on United Nations Resolution 43/243, "Declaration and Programme of Action on a Culture of Peace".
- 2. ORGANIZE. People-centric and bottom-up declaration of Schools; Barangays; Cities/ Municipalities; Provinces; and Regions as YES FOR PEACE, UNITY and DEVELOPMENT Zones based on results of the open referendum.
- 3. MOBILIZE. Engage the pro-active involvement and collective participation of the Filipino people in identifying, planning, budgeting and implementing community-based peace, development and livelihood programs projects.
- 4. GOVERGENCE. Institutionalize good governance through the convergent delivery of peace, development and livelihood programs and projects identified, planned, budgeted and implemented through Bayanihan (pro-active involvement and collective participation) of the people at all levels of government from the barangay/community to the municipal/city to the provincial to the regional to the national level.
- 5. LEGISLATION. Revision of constitutional provisions as well as laws that have impeded peace, unity and development. The process shall be consultative, people-centric, and preferably bottom-up.

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



### What is Peace Education?




"It entails providing an enabling environment for infusing peace-promoting values, skills, and attitudes into the whole life of the school. To be effective, peace education shall be implemented through encompassing all the learning areas, engaging all members of the school community (learners, teachers, other school personnel), and the wider community (local government units, parents, etc.)

More specifically, peace shall involve the following:

- \*\*\* "Creation of peacebuilding programs involving parents, and build/sustain participative structures and caring relationships among the school, families, and the community."



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Revision of constitutional provisions as well as laws that have impeded peace, unity and development. The process shall be consultative, people-centric, and preferably bottom-up to establish the people's support of the legislative agenda stipulated in the Philippine Development Plan 2023 -2028.

It shall entail direct consultations with the people by legislators and stakeholders to determine the constitutional provisions and existing laws, rules and regulations that need to be amended. Efforts to make the proposed amendments very clear and simple shall be undertaken.

Acceptability to majority of the people shall be a primordial concern.

The results of the consultation process shall be subjected to a referendum.

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- Key Result Area: Amendment of constitutional provisions and legislation/revision of laws and implementing rules and regulations.
- Key Performance Indicator: Number and quality of amended constitutional provisions and legislated/revised laws and implementing rules and regulations.
- SMART Objective: Constitutional provisions, laws and implementing rules and regulations that have held back the attainment of peace, unity and development shall have been amended and/or revised by end of June, 2028.

- Issuance of a DILG Memorandum by Secretary of the Department of the Interior and Local Government to engage the proactive involvement and collective participation of Regional, Provincial, City, Municipal and Barangay Peace and Order Councils; Local Government Units (LGUs); the Sangguniang Barangays (SBs); the Sangguniang Kabataans (SKs); the Philippine National Police (PNP); and the National Youth Commission.
- Carry out the five (5) Thematic Areas of the YES FOR PEACE Bayanihan ng Bayan campaign in coordination with the Office of the Presidential Consultant on Peace, Reconciliation and Unity (OPAPRU) through the Comprehensive Peace Process as defined by Executive Order No. 158, s. 2021:
  - · "Conflict-sensitive and peace-promoting
  - · "Whole-of-Society
  - "Empowering"





- Facilitate the proactive involvement and collective participation of the Filipino people through formal and informal channels of governance as concrete action steps with the cooperation of National Government Agencies (NGAs) with the end view of the following outcomes stipulated in the Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2023 – 2028:
  - a) "participatory governance deepened;
  - b) "public accountability and integrity bolstered;
  - government functions, systems, and mechanisms rationalized and strengthened; and
  - d) "competent, motivated, agile, and resilient public servants supported."
- Optimize the use of traditional and social media to disseminate information and updates on the implementation of the campaign.

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- Keep relevant agencies of the United Nations (UN) such as the UNICEF and UNESCO abreast of developments and progress of the campaign pursuant to Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) #16 Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions "Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels."
- Develop measures in monitoring and evaluating the key performance indicators and targets in coordination with participating agencies, e.g., DepEd, DILG, NYC, etc., involved in activities that contribute toward building a climate for peace through specific projects intrinsic to their respective mandates and functions.



## Ways Forward to Sustainability



The following is a checklist of steps that shall be undertaken to ensure sustainability of the campaign subject to the availability of material and human resources:]

- ☐ The Personal Data provided by respondents / Peace and Development volunteers (KaBayanihans) shall be used as primary data for building a community-based national peace, unity and development constituency.
- ☐ Directly challenge and negate claims of self-proclaimed armed revolutionaries that they are fighting for the rights of the Filipino people.
- ☐ Prove that the greater majority of the people reject violent extremism and terrorism as a means to wrest government power.
- Declaration of ALL Schools, Barangays, Municipalities/Cities, Provinces and Regions as YES FOR PEACE, UNITY and DEVELOPMENT ZONES that reject armed struggle whatever the cause may be until armed groups are completely isolated from the People.
- ☐ Ensure that armed struggle will never again be an option to advance the interests of the Filipino people.

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## Ways Forward to Sustainability



- Upload the compilation of ALL existing peace, unity and development services as well as livelihood projects – including how these could be accessed – of ALL National Government Agencies (NGAs) in websites of ALL NGAs and LGUs.
- ☐ Empower both the people and government workers to pursue the inclusive and participatory identification, planning and implementation for its integrated, holistic and convergent delivery.
- ☐ Urge Local Government Units to distribute USBs of ALL existing basic services as well as livelihood projects to their respective Sangguniang Barangays and Sangguniang Kabataan.
- Institutionalize the direct involvement of the people in identifying, planning and implementing basic and livelihood projects.
- □ Usher in a more rational system of budgeting and allocating government funds for people-centric projects responsive to the needs of the people and not merely the products of "creative" minds of "well-meaning" local government executives and legislators.



## Ways Forward to Sustainability


